

### REMEMBRANCE OF BAPTISM

M: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

M: In Holy Baptism, Lynn was clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness that covered all his sin. St. Paul affirms, "In Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ." <sup>23</sup> Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again."


<sup>24</sup> Martha answered, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day."

<sup>13</sup> Then one of the elders asked me, "These in white robes—who are they, and where did they come from?"


<sup>14</sup> I answered, "Sir, you know."
